Tour of Israel

Day 1 - January 7: Depart from US.

Day 2 - January 8: Israel, Yad Hashmona, and Kiryat Yearim. Overnight in Jerusalem area.

Arrive in Israel and proceed to Yad Hashmona for orientation and a tour of the Biblical Gardens. Visit Kiryat Yearim, the place where the Ark of the Covenant was kept from the time of Samuel until the time of David (1 Sam. 7). Overnight in Jerusalem area.

Day 3 - January 9: Samuel's Tomb in Rama, Michmas Pass, drive through Wadi Qelt, Mt. of Temptation, and Jericho. Overnight in Jerusalem area.

In the morning visit Rama, the site of the prophet Samuel's tomb. Continue to Michmas Pass, a route commonly used and mentioned in Scripture on several occasions. Drive through Wadi Qelt to visit the Mt. of Temptation. End your day visiting Jericho and view the ruins of the city conquered by Joshua (Josh. 6:1, 2, 20). Overnight in Jerusalem area.

Day 4 - January 10: Day in Samaria including Shiloh, Mt. Gerizim, and Oak of Moreh. Overnight in Jerusalem area.

Visit Samaria, the capital of the Northern Kingdom, and home to Ahab and Jezebel (1 Kings 16). Travel to Shiloh, a small community. During ancient times it was famous as a place where the Ark of the Covenant was kept (1 Sam. 4:4). See Mt. Gerizim and the Oak of Moreh where the Israelites recited the blessings and cursings of the Law. Overnight in Jerusalem area.

Day 5 - January 11: Judea, Tel Beer Sheva via Elah Valley and Lachish, Maon and Carmel, and Hebron. Overnight in Jerusalem area.

Travel to Judea and visit the Valley of Elah where David slew Goliath (1 Sam. 17). Continue to Beer Sheva where Abraham lived and dug seven wells (meaning of the name Beer Sheva) (Gen. 26:23). Continue to Lachish, one of the Philistine cities where David hid from King Saul (1 Sam. 22). Visit the towns of Maon and Carmel. End your day exploring Hebron and see the Cave of the Patriarchs. Abraham paid 400 shekels to purchase the cave as a place of burial for his wife Sarah (Gen. 23). Overnight in Jerusalem area.

Day 6 - January 12: Road to Emmaus, Antipatris, and Caesaria. Overnight in Netanya.

This morning walk the Road to Emmaus where Jesus met two disciples after His resurrection (Luke 24:13-28). Continue to Antipatris the city named after Herod the Great's father. During Biblical times it straddled the ancient Via Maris highway and guarded the headwaters of the Yarkon River. Explore Caesaria, the Roman capital of Judea, with its Theater and Roman Aqueduct where Cornelius became the first Gentile convert to the new covenant (Acts 10) and where Paul was imprisoned before being taken to Rome for trial. Overnight in Netanya.

Day 7 - January 13: Megiddo, Mt. Carmel, Haifa, and Acco. Overnight in Tiberias.

Travel to Megiddo (Biblical Armageddon) where 20 different cities lie superimposed upon each other. Visit Mt. Carmel where Elijah defeated the Baal prophets. You'll visit the monastery at the top of the mountain. Continue your journey to the city of Haifa. Visit the ancient port city of Acco, one of the stops on Paul's final return to Jerusalem (Acts 21:7). Overnight in Tiberias.

Day 8 - January 14: Cliffs of Arbel, Magdala, Mt. of Beatitudes, Tabcha, Capernaum, Kursi, St. Peter's fish lunch, and boat ride to Tiberias. Overnight in Tiberias.

Travel to Mt. Arbel to view the Sea of Galilee and the area where Jesus ministered. In Magdala, once home to Mary Magdalene, visit a recently discovered first-century synagogue. Visit the peaceful Mt. of Beatitudes. Explore Capernaum, the center of Jesus' ministry in the Galilean region. Visit the synagogue, which stands on the site where Jesus taught. Recall His teaching and preaching the gospel of the kingdom. Return to the Sea of Galilee area to visit Kursi, the likely area where Christ cast the demons into the herd of swine. Enjoy a St. Peter's fish lunch at the Ein Gev Kibbutz. Afterwards, take a boat ride across the Sea of Galilee to Tiberias. Overnight in Tiberias.

Day 9 - January 15: Metulah overlook, Banias, Golan Heights, Gamla, and Hamat Gader. Overnight in Tiberias.

Drive north to upper Galilee today and visit Metulah, the strategic city located on the Lebanonese border and the site of the Good Fence linking the two countries. Continue to Banias (Caesarea Philippi) where Jesus traveled with His disciples and nearby Peter made his great confession to Jesus, "Thou art the Christ, the Son of the living God" (Matt. 16:16). Ascend into the Golan Heights and view Syria from the strategic high plateau. Visit Gamla, the ancient Jewish city which heroically stood against a siege by the Roman Army in the 1st century. Continue to the warm springs at Hamat Gader, known since antiquity and home to a modern-day crocodile farm amongst other tourist attractions. Overnight in Tiberias.

Day 10 - January 16: Archaeology dig. Overnight in Jerusalem. Participate in an archaeological dig today at one of the many ancient dig sites in Israel. Overnight in Jerusalem.

Day 11 - January 17: Mt. Tabor, Tel Jezreel, Gideon Spring, and Beit Shean. Overnight in Jerusalem.

Journey to Mt. Tabor and stand where Jesus was transfigured (Matt. 17:2). Travel to Ein Harod (Judg. 7:1), the spring where Gideon gathered his men to fight the Midianites. Continue to Beit Shean, a city continuously inhabited for over 5,000 years. Return to Jerusalem for your overnight stay.

Day 12 - January 18: Herodium, Day in Jerusalem including the Mt. of Olives, Tower of David Museum, lunch in Old City, finish at Garden Tomb, and head to airport for flight back home.

This morning visit the Herodium, site of King Herod's Palace. Continue to the Mt. of Olives, where Jesus ascended into heaven (Acts 1:9-12). Explore the Tower of David Museum and have lunch in the Old City. Finally, visit the Garden Tomb where Christ was buried and see the empty tomb because He is risen! Transfer to the Tel Aviv airport for your flight home.


